Goal 1: Expand and communicate the scholarship of academic advising.	Continue to spread TPH scholarship through and beyond the association.	Host TPH virtual discussions and pursue other innovative methods for TPH members to share their scholarly work with others	TPH will host at least two virtual discussions via Zoom in the first year The steering committee will meet at least once to discuss other venues for developing and sharing TPH-scholarship (podcasts, writing groups, informal scholarly mentors, etc.)	Connect with other AC chairs to encourage relevant members to propose ideas for virtual discussions related to theory/philosophy/history of advising in their area (e.g., LGBTQAA AC members presenting on queer theory, performativity, etc. and how these can be used to understand advising) Connect with Wendy Troxel about increased support for humanities-oriented/theoretical scholarship in advising	Time commitment of these activities is always a challenge, but by utilizing the steering committee to plan the events, presenters can focus on developing a brief presentation and list of discussion questions for the virtual discussion. Carefully planning when these events happen will also help to encourage attendance (e.g., avoiding very busy times of year, giving advance notice to plan for the discussion, etc.)	So far we have held one virtual discussion (Ryan Scheckel's <i>Slow Advisor</i> session, which was attended by over 50 people). The steering committee has met several times to discuss opportunities for events and activities that will respond to the needs of the TPH AC. Several other events discussed	We will continue to host events related to TPH-thinking in advising. We have several events that are not yet scheduled but are in the works, including a two-part philosophy of advising workshop in partnership with an advisor development professional at Wayne State University, a panel of authors who have published TPH-inflected scholarship, and

Given the ongoing nature of the COVID-19 pandemic, we will continue to plan opportunities that are thoughtful and meaningful for our members but also respectful of the increased demands on advisors' time and sometimes limited bandwidth for additional time in virtual meetings.

TPH will pursue at least one cross-AC partnership focused on equity and social justice	The TPH steering committee will have a subcommittee devoted to cross-AC partnerships for equity and social justice The members of the partnership will create at least one new resource for members (theory primer, article, blog post, etc.) connecting relevant theory, philosophy, or history to some dimension of equity and social justice	Connect with the proposed Social Justice AC for partnerships on creating new scholarship and engaging in praxis utilizing third-wave (critical, postmodern, poststructural) theories as they apply to advising practice Seek partnerships with other ACs and groups relevant to equity and social justice theory	Cross-AC partnerships require a lot of trust and buy-in. This goal will likely take more than one year, but has the potential to meaningfully impact TPH members and other NACADA members in the creation of new resources about social justice theory/philosophy/history and how it can influence our practice as advisors.
