NACADA's 2023 Annual Conference Registration & Participant FAQs

Question: How do I register for the in-person conference in Orlando, FL?

Answer: Registration for the 2023 NACADA Annual Conference is currently open. You can access the registration here.

Question: What is the cost to attend in-person?

Answer: The in-person early registration cost for members is \$500 until August 16. The cost for non-members is \$700 until August 16. You can view the full fee schedule on the conference registration webpage.

Question: What does my conference registration include?

Answer: Your conference registration includes access to the Region/Global Updates and Connection Time, Keynote Address and Welcome Reception on Wednesday evening, access to all individual sessions, Continental Breakfast Thursday, Friday, Saturday, time to visit with our Sponsors and Exhibitors throughout the conference, the Poster Session, Advising Communities Division Fair, Common Reading, and the Closing Keynote to wrap up the conference on Saturday. Registered attendees will also receive a conference bag, lanyard, and name badge.

Question: When does the conference begin?

Answer: The conference kicks off Wednesday, October 4 with preconference workshops starting at 9 am, Region/Global Updates and Connection Time beginning at 6 pm and the Keynote Address and Welcome Reception following shortly after. Registration will be open Tuesday, October 3 from 4-7 pm, on Wednesday, October 4th from 8 am to 8 pm and throughout the conference.

Question: Where should I stay?

Answer: NACADA has arranged for a block of rooms at the Rosen Shingle Creek, Rosen Plaza Hotel, and Rosen Inn at Pointe Orlando. Question: Will shuttle service be available to overflow hotels?

Answer: Shuttle service will run daily for registered participants between Rosen Plaza Hotel and Rosen Inn at Pointe Orlando to Rosen Shingle Creek where the conference is being held. A scheduled will be shared closer to the date of conference.

Question: What is the dress code for the conference?

Question: What if I need to find quiet, safe spaces while at the conference venue?

Answer: There will be a designated wellness room at the conference.

Question: Will there be security on-site?

arise.

Question: Will there be gender neutral bathrooms available throughout the conference site?
