No prior published writing required. We are looking for stories from a diverse range of professionals across the world.

This pocket guide will be focused on the importance of academic advising and the effects it has in the lives of students and advising personnel.

There are three objectives:

- 1. To show through real-life the effects of academic advising on students and their educational trajectories.
- 2. To raise the morale of academic advisers by highlighting how their work positively influences others, such as their impact on students, staff, and faculty in higher education.
- 3. To highlight how working with students has positively impacted advisers' lives.

This edited collection of stories will provide an intimate and practical view of frontline advising through personal narratives. Each story provides a beginning, a middle, and an end which allows readers to travel along with each advising journey and gain perspective through a narrative lens in these real-life moments of passion, growth, and hope.
